# 6. Business Arising

- 6.1 Toronto Road Walk-In Clinic
  - S. Forsyth advised that the Northumberland County Accessibility Advisory Committee has not conducted an assessment of the accessibility of the Toronto Road walk-in clinic since its opening. Once the NCAAC has completed their evaluations and provided feedback, S. Forsyth will provide an update.

#### 6.2 Crosswalks

Discussion ensued with respect to crosswalks, J. Davidson advised that a walkability study was conducted a few years ago that is relevant today and

can be shared with the committee. The study identifies areas where pedestrian improvements are necessary, which are taken into consideration during road reconstruction projects.

## 6.3 Accessible Parking

Discussion ensued with respect to the need for directional signage downtown that indicates where there are accessible parking spots, and more awareness surrounding the ability for residents with accessible parking permits to utilize any parking spot. ## 10.1 The Schools Program

S. Forsyth provided an overview of the schools program and a brief discussion ensued with respect to the development of sub-committees.

## 10.2 Private Property Encroaching on Sidewalks

Discussion ensued with respect to private property encroaching on sidewalks, J. Davidson advised that any obstructions to sidewalks such as overgrown hedges, trees, and snow are cleared by Works and Engineering staff as per Minimum Maintenance Standards.

### 10.3 E-Bikes and E-Vehicles

Councillor V. Mink, Chair informed the committee that over the summer break communication was sent via email regarding legislation of e-bikes and e-vehicles, and discussion ensued with respect to:

- Accessibility and safety concerns associated with the usage of ebikes and e-vehicles
- Specifications and designated operating areas, which falls under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Transportation.

- The development of municipal policies or by-laws to prohibit the use of e-bikes and e-vehicles on specific roads.
- The experiences and challenges faced by neighbouring municipalities regarding the use of these vehicles.

## 10.4 Chamber of Commerce Representative

Discussion ensued with respect to the addition of a Chamber of Commerce representative on the AAC. Councillor V. Mink, Chair advised that while the terms of reference do not currently stipulate the inclusion of a Chamber of Commerce representative, the advisory committee by-law is scheduled for review in 2025. At this time, the committee will have the opportunity to provide feedback and make recommendations regarding the terms of reference.
